

What is JPUSA?

Jesus People USA is a Christian Intentional Community located in Uptown, Chicago. We are a product of the Jesus Movement of the 60's and 70's, and were first established in 1972. The years have brought about a lot of changes and what we look like today hardly seems to resemble the group of 20-ish born-again hippies traveling by bus across the country.

Today, there are around 250 community members. We are a church that lives together: families, single people, and empty nesters ranging in age from 0 to 80. JPUSA is a part of the Evangelical Covenant Church, and meets for worship, classes, and fellowship throughout the week. We operate several businesses to support ourselves financially: roofing supply, a music label, T-shirt printing, and a coffee shop to name a few. Our needs are met out of a common purse that is supported by these businesses. We also have a strong ministry emphasis on caring for the poor and homeless, having started Chicago's second-largest homeless shelter, Cornerstone Community Outreach (CCO). CCO houses around 300 people each night, providing three meals a day to residents and one meal a week to anyone in need off the streets.

What should I expect from a trip to JPUSA?

1. **Community life** You can expect a welcoming environment, living for a short time alongside people who, in many cases, have been living and doing ministry together for several decades. Most people who visit can expect an eye-opening experience: seeing life, worship, and ministry lived out in diverse ways.

2. **Ministry** You can expect to be introduced to concepts of poverty and homelessness within our country. You will meet people at CCO from all walks of life. You will get to see people who daily live ministry to the poor and needy around them.

3. Leisure/Fun/Free time JPUSA is situated about three blocks from Lake Michigan. Depending on the weather, you can expect chances to view the Lake or swim in it. Also, we are close to a number of ethnic restaurants and several different parts of Chicago's public transit system. One common activity is to take a partial or whole day to go around town and sight-see.

How is a trip to JPUSA different from other trips?

Living in community lends a different perspective on life, culture, and faith. During your visit, your group has an opportunity to live in a small community of its own in our group housing while participating in the larger community of JPUSA. During your time at CCO, we encourage groups to think of what it would feel like to be constantly on the receiving end with little opportunity to give back and to rethink ways that we can "consider others better than ourselves." We value art, culture, and music and challenge your group to think of ways to engage their generation with the Gospel by deciphering media messages to hear what people want and need.

Things you should bring on your trip:

Open Eyes

- If you don't decide ahead of time to pay attention to what is around you, you may very well miss something amazing or important.

Open Mind

- You will probably see things you will not, at first, expect, or understand. Prepare to process and ask questions!

Open Heart

- There will be times when it feels like you cannot deal with the emotional impact of what you are experiencing. Those are exactly the times when God is working in you!

Clothing

- Bring enough clothing for your entire stay (assume you will not be doing laundry)
- It's OK to wear things more than once
- Please, for your own sake, and that of the people to whom you will minister, dress modestly. Ask your group's leader for definition
- Don't bring anything you can't handle either losing or ruining (stains, rips, paint, etc.)
- You will not need dress clothes (even for church on Sunday)
- Don't forget your swimsuit (Summer)
- You will probably want clothes specifically for painting, as this is a common activity
- Closed-toed shoes for work times

Toiletries

- Toilet paper is provided, but you should bring everything else you will need, including a towel and washcloth

Bedding

- Mattresses are provided, but you should bring either sheets and a blanket or a sleeping bag, as well as your own pillow

Miscellaneous

- Bible
- Book(s)
- Journaling Supplies
- Games (optional)
